



Geography

The children are given opportunities within the subject lesson and the broader curriculum, to explore and develop their knowledge of the local area, the British Isles and the wider world. The children develop skills and experience fieldwork within the local area, playground and wood visits. The children can find out about significant features of town life, comparing how different areas within the locality are used, as well as how to draw, read and follow simple maps.

The topics covered provide a means for the children to 'travel the world'. Their own experiences can provide a resource and body of knowledge to progress from. Within the classes there will be a range of resources such as models, maps, books, IT and so on. These provide the means to explore and understand the similarities and differences when comparing geographical features, characteristics and knowledge of places.

The classrooms show progression in expectation and understanding through topic, for example visual displays, small world, art and so on. The continuous provision can enrich the depth of experience. It allows for supportive activities and challenges, enabling children to pursue their own learning independently, or with friends.
